Fagles' is an excellent translation, and the reader is outstanding. In mcellen's performance is great. His writing includes the Little Iliad, The Odyssey, the Cypria, the Capture of Oechalia, The Margites and many others. There is an earlier review here that states that the speed of the recording has been slowed down in one of the chapters. These outstanding qualities count for little as the sound quality is so poor that at times one gives up listening out of sheer frustration. The recording has a few issues; specifically, the recording has been slowed down in one extended section the playback speed is slightly reduced, dropping the pitch of the reader's voice somewhat. The fact that other reviewers have noted the poor quality of this book for years and Audible has done nothing about it really tells you something about this company. Later, a section of narration lasting several minutes, where it seemed the speed of the recording was reduced by a small percentage. No matter how good McKellen is, listening to someone's voice slowed down or sped up is too annoying, especially for a work that already demands so much attention. The book has a 3.8star rating out of 5. Advanced embedding details, examples, and help! The real soul of literature is Poetry. The speed of McKellen's reading drops to a deep bass voice at a seemingly slowed down or McKellen was suffering from a serious cold on the day of the recording. This is not a deal breaker but listeners should at least be forewarned of this fault. The audiobook also excludes Bernard Knox's introduction that is available in the Penguin print edition. There is, however, some annoying and distracting music (sounds like a toddler poking at 1980s synthesiser) which randomly intrudes for a few seconds every now and then; not a big issue, but it would be great if it wasn't there. So the 24 Chapter starts are only occasionally equal to the beginnings of the 24 Verses of the Odyssey. As others have stated, the pitch also varies in places which is a shame because the narration is superb. It is a mixture of a classic adventure, fantasy, history and Greek mythology. This book is an excellent reading of the Odyssey. The recording is from the pre-digital download era and the audio chapters are based on approximate 30 minute timings (1 side of a cassette tape?), regardless of the actual Homeric verses. To read the book, you can download it from the website. I have yet to see a resolution. However, despite the "unabridged" label, this version appears to be subtly edited or cut down. Some files sound pristine and clear, every OTHER file sounds like they recorded it through a closet wall. Homer wrote to poems which became the reason for his popularity in the literary world. He flows through the text as though the text as written. Just enough to lower the pitch of Ian's voice and make him sound a bit tired. Despite these, the reader remains easily understandable at all times, and the overall quality of the work remains very high. The narration is excellent, as is the translation; however, the production is terrible. About the Author Homer: Homer is said to be the writer of ancient Greek poems. Based on the rest of the narration, I am confident that this was not the case, but rather an unfortunate effect of the audio editing. I highly recommend this audio book, and can see it as a wonderful supplement to a high school or college course in which the Odyssey is required reading. However the music does nothing & the story trails on. However, at about five hours in, the recording began to exhibit technical glitches related to speed. Both Robert Fagles translation and Ian McKellen's reading are superb. This is the age of options and you might find that your customers have gone elsewhere because you stopped caring. Why or why not? They do not detract much from the deeds of the most unlucky of heroes, Odysseus; but there were times in which they did not seem to enhance the story much either. There were a couple of places where there seemed to be minor technical issues. What happens with the family of King and what are the matters of the Greek Kingdom after the war? A real disappointment, not because of a poor text or bad reader, but because of a careless or indifferent presentation. Any additional comments? A bad listen. I have to admit, I was a little surprised at how many tears were shed by practically everyone included in the story. Then, later on, Penguin Classics republished this book on 30th November 2006.
